All-year-round/ shoulder season travel

## **CHANGING TRAVELLER BEHAVIOUR**

- Return of stability in holiday planning. Decisive factors when choosing a holiday are consistent
- Europe remains the top target by some margin
- Financial circumstances are less of a barrier this year. Brits are still keen on spending on holiday experiences but will skip shopping part. Guilt is #1 feeling around non-essential spending
- By June 20% still haven't booked their holidays but plan to.
- Brits cannot get enough cruises both for this year as last minute and for 2025-2026
- Affluent travellers spend so much more on cruises then pre-pandemic
- Millennials become new audience for cruises, although still behind Continental Europe trend
- Value to get in the destination and cost control All inclusive and cruises growth across different demographics





## **CHANGING TRAVELLER BEHAVIOUR**

- Sustainable choices are important but mainly if someone picks up the cost of it.
- The gap between holidaying in Britain and going abroad is almost back to pre-pandemic
- 70+% of luxury travellers come from **diverse traveller demographics**: very important factor for marketing and product: diversity, inclusion, respect, safety, being seen but not exposed.
- The **difference in income** between a mainstream traveller and a Premium globetrotter is only 12%.
- Consumers are diversifying how they search: it's changing, becoming more complex and more expensive
- **TikTok** is not #1 in reach but potentially the future as it's the only trusted source of information for Gen Z. It also has the highest engagement rate for Travel & Hospitality.
- 80+% of travellers are destination-indifferent

## Forecast behavior 2024

- 2024 shaping up to be an extremely positive year for travel
- 89% of the Austrian population plans to travel
- Age plays a significant role: 93,3% of Generation Z express their plans to take at least one vacation
- Only 29% are bound by school holidays
- Noticeable trend outside the traditional holiday peaks (May, September & October)
- Vacation budgets increased avg. budget: € 1.882 p.P.
- Main vacation: 8-14 days typically beach vacation

## Forecast behavior 2024

- Most popular destinations 2024:
  - → Thailand, Maldives, Tanzania
  - → in Europe: Northern Europe, Greece, Italy, Spain and Portugal
  - → winter season: Lapland in Finland; summer season: US and Canada
- Top holiday motivations: beach holidays (36%), individual long-distance journeys (34%)
- Bookings are made 90-120 days in advance → pre-pandemic
- Increasing Interest in sustainable accommodations
- Spending behavior is similar to 2023 → 3.443 CHF



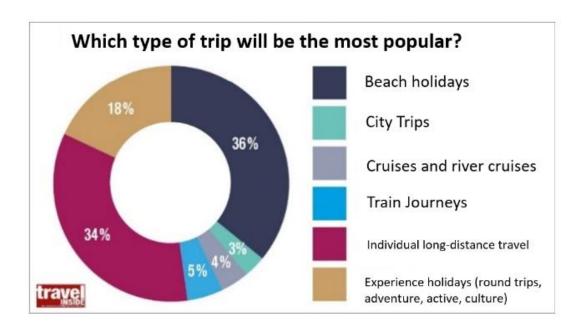

- Sun and beach holidays remains top travel motivation





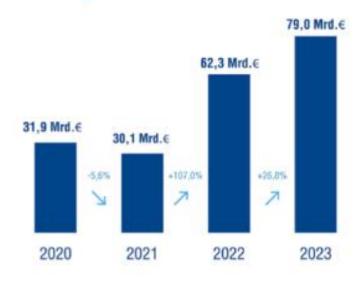
## Economy

- → decentralised market





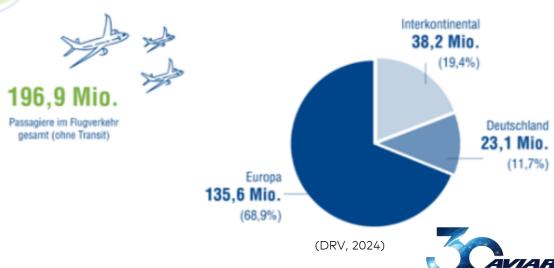
#### **Travel expenses of Germans**

## Forecast behavior 2024

- 2/3 of the German population plan one or more holidays (especially in the summer months)
- DRV (German travel association) records an increase in revenue despite a slight decline in the number of travellers
- focus on one or two main holiday trips
- Germany will remain most popular holiday destination
- most popular package destination flights: Turkey and Greece
- Long-haul destinations: increase in travellers by 11% (UAE, USA, Namibia, Japan, Sri Lanka and Australia)
- Average vacation duration: 13,3 days (13,0 pre-covid)
- Germany as one of the main markets for the cruise industry

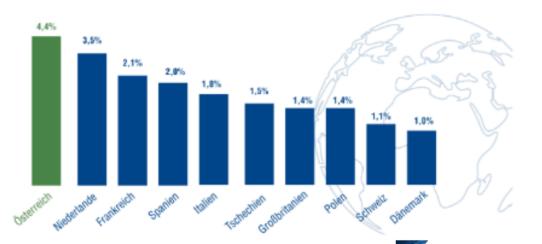






#### Short holiday destinations abroad

## **Tour Operators**

- Germany as one of the biggest markets for Tour Operator package holidays (47% market share)
- Turnover in tour operator trips in 2023 represents 37,3 billion €, 31% higher than 2022
- increased demand for individual customization, personalization and new unknown destinations → Tour Operators need to adjust portfolio

## **Travel Designers & Agencies**

- Turnover of € 20,7 billion (€ 16,4 billion in 2022)
- Cruise with the most significant gain: 41% revenue growth
- crucial role in luxury travel by providing personalized services and catering to individual requirements
- most popular: beach resort vacations and city trips (culture)
- nature-connected travel and green tourism as significant factor for growth

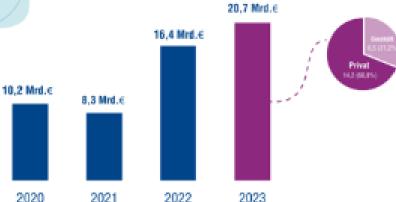

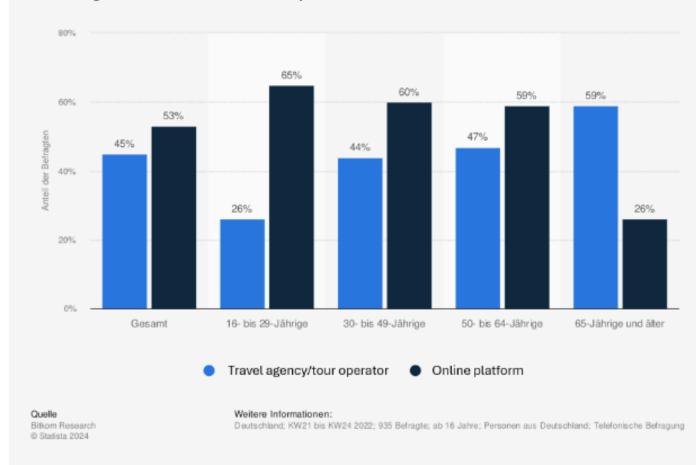






## **Booking behaviour**

## **German Market Conclusion**

- 2/3 of the German population plans on going on one or more holidays
- High demand especially for holidays during summer months
- Revenue for tour operators: full recovery expected by 2024
- · Overall positive development for long-haul destinations
- Individual customization, personalization and new unknown destinations are key for further growth within the TO sector
- Consumer trends in luxury travel highlight a desire for beach resort vacations and city trips. → Travel agencies play a crucial role
- Total revenues of German travel agencies increased by 30.8%, with the cruise segment experiencing the most significant expansion (+41%)
- Online booking trends (53%) continue to grow in importance
- Booking channels vary significantly based on travellers' age groups.
